### EMERGENCY SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE UNDER THREAT IN ISRAEL

As the war in Israel continues and the needs shift daily, your generosity has helped The Fellowship respond swiftly and compassionately. So far this year, you have helped The Fellowship provide:

#### SECURITY IMPACT IN 2025 SO FAR

<b>1,500 food boxes to Syria</b>	Emergency food boxes were distributed to Christians and Druze under attack in Syria, just across Israel's border
<b>1 generator</b>	A generator was given to the northern city of Tiberias in Israel to be used in situations of power outages and to provide electricity to essential institutions throughout the city
<b>1 transport vehicle</b>	We provided several months of rental costs of a transport vehicle, which will assist residents returning to their homes in Kiryat Shmona and surrounding northern communities by transporting residents, especially elderly with mobility issues, as well as materials and tools for renovations
<b>Food to 180,000 people for Passover</b>	Food boxes and food cards were given to over 180,000 people worldwide for Passover, including 50,000 households in Israel
<b>16,000 clothing cards</b>	Clothing cards were given to 16,000 children in Israel so they can purchase new clothing around the Passover holiday

### Supported by You

This Passover, a Fellowship volunteer and injured IDF soldier delivered a holiday food box to two elderly Holocaust survivors in Israel. The couple tells us how they evacuated as little children during World War II, and during the current war were forced to evacuate due to Hamas attacks. This was their first Passover since returning home. They say, "We've been through so much. Evacuation, war, loss, *aliyah*... and now this war. This fear, it's different. It settles in your bones ... We're deeply touched by the support of The Fellowship."
